President's Report

Introduction

Facility and Asset management

Parking

Our club has acquired 14 car parks thanks to the work of a number of members in particular Elizabeth Mountain, Bob Gingold, Nick Chapman and Peter Freer. We have been given the car spaces for a peppercorn rent. The licence is for two years. It will still take a few months before we can take possession of the car park.

The parking issue has been huge for the club over the past years. Ever since the change to parking arrangements in the Parliamentary triangle came up, it has been an matter of great concern. This has taken up much time and energy as well as being frustrating and trying for those involved in negotiating with the various governmental agencies, offices and Ministers with a say in the matter. The club is very thankful to those who have taken the lead in investigating and negotiating this issue. While these high hurdles have been overcome, we need to remember that work is still to be done on the practicalities of establishing the car park.

Lawns

I'd like to acknowledge members who due to their efforts have worked on the lawns. Peter Freer our greenskeeper with his team of helpers (Andrew Davies, Greg Diprose, Adrienne Fazekas, Tim Murphy, Paul Nelson, Ian Nicol and Stephen Richards) have the lawns in a good and mostly flat condition on which many members have enjoyed themselves. Bob Gingold and Stephen Richards do the lines for us.

Advocate and promote excellence

Canberra continues to provide players for the CNSW AC and GC teams and players have achieved state and national honours as members of the club. We are proud of you all and well done!

The committee have performed very well this term and I would like to thank them sincerely. Stephen Richards has been an excellent Captain giving his time and energy freely. Judy Tier as marketing manager has contributed hugely and Rodney Teakle as secretary has kept things running smoothly. Thanks to Margo Davies, Peter Freer and Pam Cohen. Pam also manages the clubhouse and our supplies in an exemplary manner.

Elizabeth Mountain as our Heritage Officer has applied for a grant for a new Conservation and Management Plan. Elizabeth has provided our club with her time and expertise and done a wonderful effort and I would like to say a great big thank you and I agree with the nomination of Elizabeth for life membership.

The playing committee members Captain Stephen Richards, Andrew Davies, Greg Diprose, Peter Freer and Glen Whitehead deserve thanks for their efforts.

Judy Tier organised a successful Floriade event and a Senior's Week Come & Try event both of which gained us new members. Well done!

A sustainable and active membership

The club has been very active and member numbers have increased. Welcome to our newer members. Many members have participated in club competitions - 33 members played in the club Handicap competition in the second half of 2015 and 30 members in the Open competitions in the first half of 2016. Congratulations to the winners and runners up.

Alan Honey represented Australia in the 2016 AC World Croquet Championship. Peter Freer and Alan Honey were members of the CNSW State GC and AC teams respectively. Nick Chapman, Alan Honey and Stephen Pearce won National AC singles 2015-2016 events and Peter Freer was runner up in the 2016 GC Australian Championships. The club's Division 1 and 2 teams won the 2016 CNSW GC Pennants. The Division 3 team made the qualifying rounds. Congratulations to all.

Gateball at the club continues to grow and thirteen members represented the club around Australia in the last year with some great results. We were winners in the 2015 Queensland Championship, being undefeated, and the Victorian Gateball Championship Doubles. We were runners up in the NSW Gateball Championship Doubles and the Victorian Gateball Championship and the doubles. Coaching modules were carried out over 6 weeks.

Andrew Davies deserves thanks for his role as coaching coordinator. Our comprehensive player development program continues. Bob Gingold, Peter Freer and Ben Freasier have all delivered our coaching modules in AC and GC gaining new members.

Two U3A courses were conducted in 2015-16 which attracted 24 participants. Thanks to Adrienne Fazekas, Andrew Davies, Margo Davies and particularly Judy Tier who has done so much to initiate and organise these courses. These courses have been a major source of new members with 18 new CCC members obtained through them. Congratulations and thanks!

Come & Try Sundays have continued – John Harris has retired after 7 years and handed over the reins to Bob Gingold in a new role as Coordinator Come & Try. Ten Come & Try days were held and many people attended and enjoyed themselves, I believe three are now members. A big thank you to John for his contribution to the club.

Club social and playing events

Social activities continue at the club with a very successful club dinner and christmas party enjoyed by members this year. During the daylight saving months, weekly twilight GC play followed by well attended suppers are a very relaxing way to enjoy the club amenities.

The club held the Tavender Trophy which is an annual gateball in-house competition — congratulations to the winners Glen Whitehead and Adrienne Fazekas. The President's Day including all three mallet sports and lunch afterwards went well. Many members attended and enjoyed the club at its best in autumn. A few bottles of clubhouse wine were handed out as prizes.

A big thank you to Andrew Davies as Hiring Co-ordinater who has helped us raise over \$8,000 of income. 19 club members have taken the hirings; they are Jill Jones, Kate McLoughlin, Paul Nelson, Richard Meacock, Ian Nicol, Hilary White, Ben Freasier, Linda Freasier, Gerda Lambeck, Yvonne and John Grattan, Judy Tier, Adrienne Fazekas, Rodney Teakle, Bob Gingold, Pam Cohen, Peter Freer and Margo and Andrew Davies. The revenue raised from hirings represents a quarter of the club's total revenue and is a very important activity to keep our fees reasonable. If you wish to volunteer please contact Andrew.

Barb Piggott, ACA National Coaching Director, ran AC & GC workshops for us and Peter Freer ran lessons in ricochet and GC tactics and how to win segments which were well attended. A representative from RPM mallets attended the club to allow our members to try different mallets and discussed how to choose what you want in a mallet.

I have certainly embraced the game of croquet and the club since I joined in 2010. I play association and golf croquet and also gateball. I have enjoyed my year as President and taken out the first modern day "Women's Open GC" final. I encourage all members to help in the running of our club and to play social and competition croquet.
